Merit Scholarships, Grants and Awards

All students offered admission to DelVal are considered for a merit scholarship, which is awarded by the Office of Admission.

First-time Freshmen Merit Scholarships - Students must enroll at Delaware Valley University as a full-time, undergraduate student to be eligible for the merit scholarships listed below:

Presidential Scholarship \$27,000
Faculty Scholarship \$25,000
Trustee Scholarship \$22,000
Challenge Grant \$18,000
Heritage Award \$14,000

**The scholarship stays the same every year as long as you maintain a specific GPA at DelVal (varies based on scholarship)*

Transfer Students (available to transfer applicants)

Presidential Scholarship	\$21,000	Cumulative GPA of 3.5 and higher
Faculty Scholarship	\$19,000	Cumulative GPA of 3.49 – 3.0
Trustee Scholarship	\$17,000	Cumulative GPA of 2.99 – 2.50
Challenge Grant	\$15,000	Cumulative GPA of 2.49 – 2.0
Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship	\$1,000	Membership in PTK Honor Society

*Students must enroll at Delaware Valley University as a full time undergraduate student to be eligible for the awards listed above.

Grants and Awards

Need-Based Grants (available to first-year and transfer applicants)

Benefit Grant	Varies	Based on financial need as determined by the FAFSA
Sibling Scholarship	\$2,000	Two or more siblings enrolled simultaneously
Federal Pell Grant (2020/2021)	\$6,345 - \$639	Based on financial need as determined by the FAFSA
PA State Grant	(Estimate) \$4,000 - \$500	Eligible PA residents who file the FAFSA by May 1

Applying for Financial Aid

Step 1: Apply for admission to Delaware Valley University. You do not need to wait to apply for financial aid until after you receive an admission decision. In order to receive a financial aid award, you must be accepted for admission.

Step 2: As soon as possible after **October 1**, you and your family should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which can be submitted online at www.fafsa.gov. Pennsylvania residents should file the FAFSA before the **May 1** state grant deadline. Be sure to list Delaware Valley University to receive your information. **Our college code is 003252.**

Step 3: After your FAFSA has been received and you have been admitted to DelVal, a financial aid package will be prepared and emailed to you. Review your financial aid package. Respond to requests for information such as tax returns or documents. Missing information may delay your financial aid award process.
